ORDER

Fee Structure for students admitted in Academic Sessions 2010-11 : Table –'A'

1. The Admission and Fee Regulatory Committee (hereinafter referred to as 'AFRC') constituted under Madhya Pradesh Niji Vyavsayik Shikshan Sanstha (Pravesh Ka Viniyaman Avam Shulk Ka Nirdharan) Adhinyam, 2007 (hereinafter referred to as 'Act') to determine fee structure under section 9 of the said Act, has formulated the framework for fee fixation, keeping in view the guiding principles laid down in 'The Madhya Pradesh Niji Vyavsayik Shikshan Sanstha (Pravesh Ka Viniyaman Avam Shulk Ka Nirdharan) Adhinyam, 2007 and Regulations of Fixation of Fee 2008 notified on 15 April 2008.
2. AFRC has considered 2010-11, 2011-12 & 2012-13 as a three year block for finalizing the fee structure as per the regulations relating to the fixation of fee in private unaided professional Institutions published in M.P. Gazette dated 15th April 2008.
3. The Committee also discussed the impact of Institutional preference quota promulgated by the State Government from session 2010-11 and notification issued by the State Government on 7th June, 2010 in this regard. The Committee was of the opinion that looking at the dismal outlook for this year regarding filling of the all the seats in various institution, it is very difficult to assess the exact number of students taking admissions against such seats as admissions will be continued up to late July, 2010 as per notification of the counseling authority for this category.
4. Considering the first year of implementation of Institutional Preference quota based on merit and very low number of admissions last year, it would not be appropriate for the Committee to appreciate and evolve a policy in the light of notification issued by the State Government on 7th June, 2010 in such short span of time, as the Committee



itself has been notified on 1st July, 2010. Under such circumstances, the Committee feels constrained to declare the fee structure for the session 2010-11 only and shall be continued with its process for finalization of fee structure for sessions 2011-12, 2012-13 in due course.

5. While fixing / reviewing the fee structure under section 9 of the Act, all the parameters have been considered.
6. Initial cost/interest cost incurred on setting up of initial infrastructure as per Regulatory body norms for getting the approval has not been allowed.
7. To have uniformity of the rates as well as to ensure the evenly spread over the charging of depreciation on the useful life of the assets, the rates prescribed in the Schedule XIV of the Companies Act, 1956 have been made applicable. AFRC therefore allowed depreciation as per the provisions of the Companies Act 1956 under the Straight Line Method. For books, a uniform rate of 10% has been prescribed.
8. AFRC has allowed Rs 4000 per year for growth and development and for the purpose institutions are required to maintain separate accounts. Institutions shall not be allowed to incur revenue expenditure from this fund.
9. Institution/courses having accreditation are allowed Rs 4000=00 as extra development fund for further development and to maintain the pace of development.
10. To meet the expenditure, average of actual strength of students till 2009-10 and sanctioned strength for the subsequent year has been considered with a concept of weighted realisation.
11. The Institutions shall be under obligation to pay the salaries and allowances to the Faculty as per the norms laid down by the Regulatory Body.
12. Surplus, if any, shall be utilized towards growth and development of the same institutions and would not be diverted to other institutions of its governing trust/society.
13. In the light of above parameters, submitted accounts were scrutinized and at the time of hearing itself the institutions was apprised regarding the fee fixation frame work & the deficiencies in the submitted documentation. Institutions were heard for their future plans for growth and further clarifications/ information relating to incurred expenditures was obtained from them.



14. AFRC is pleased to announce the fee structure for academic session 2010-11 as indicated below in TABLE -'A'. The fee as fixed for academic session 2010-11, shall further be regulated as under:

- i). The determined fee structure for academic session 2010-11, will be applicable to the students seeking admission in the academic session 2010-11. The determined fee however, will remain the same during their respective course tenure.
- ii) The determined fee will be a consolidated fee comprising tuition fee and other miscellaneous fees as provided in the governing regulations and the institutions would not be allowed to charge fee for any other reason or under any other head, not prescribed under this order. If this is violated, the amount so collected shall be considered as charging capitation fee for which legal action as per the provisions of the Act shall be taken.
- iii) The caution money (refundable) will be the same (as indicated in the TABLE 'A' below) and as decided earlier by Justice Dwivedi Committee. This could be charged only once at the time of admission.
- iv) An institution can charge fee from users only for facilities like **transport, hostel & training and placement (T&P, Training and placement (Only for those who are willing to participate in the campus placement organized by the institute and studying in third year or onwards) which are optional on actual cost i.e. no profit no loss basis subject to a reasonable upper cap fixed by AFRC for each activity as given below :**

S.No.	Head	Upper Cap
01	Transportation	Rs. 3500/- per semester
02	Hostel	Rs. 3000/- per semester
03	Training & Placement	Rs. 500/- per semester (in the year of placement only)

These upper caps shall be also applicable to all existing students from 2007-08 batches onwards.

v) **Penalty for late fees:-**

Considering wide variation in charges levied by various Institutions in case of late payment of fees or any other reason, it has been considered necessary to



put a cap on such charges also. It is therefore, mandated that this penalty for any reason shall not exceed Rs. 25.00 (Rs. Twenty five only) per day, subject to further cap of Rs.500.00 (Rs. Five hundred only) for delay up-to one month, Rs.1000.00 (Rs. One thousand only) for delay for more then one month but not exceeding three months and Rs.2000.00 (Rs. Two thousand only) for delay for more than three months but not exceeding six months. Thereafter action may be initiated as per university rules.

15. This fee structure shall be applicable only when the concerned institution gets due approval from the AICTE for the academic session 2010-11.

16. If at any stage, it is observed that the institution has submitted some wrong information or deliberately hides some relevant information or some calculation mistake is observed then committee reserves all the rights to revise the declared fee structure or to initiate any other legal action as per the act provisions.
